



# Are you wondering if you qualify?...

Below is a brief summary illustration of how to qualify for each level.



- A valid Driver's License is required.
- Incumbents must obtain a Commercial Learner's Permit within sixty (60) days of employment.
- Incumbents must obtain a Vermont Inspection Mechanic Certification within sixty (60) days of employment.
- Incumbents must obtain a Class A Commercial Driver's License, with air-brake certification and tanker endorsement, within six (6) months of employment.
  - \* Class B Commercial Driver's License, with air-brake certification for AOT Fleet Technician I
- Incumbents must provide their own hand tools.
